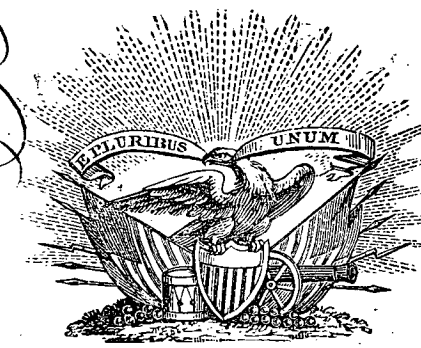


The United States of America,

Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850,

entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 11,266 for 40 acres,

issued in favor of *John Hoffman, Private in Captain Otto's Company, First Regiment Pennsylvania Volunteer Riflemen War 1812*
