To All to whom these Presents shall come, GREETING :

1360 Know Ye, That, *George Huffstutter, junr. Assignee of
George Huffstutter, Senr.*

having deposited in the *General Land Office*, a Certificate of the Register
of the *Land Office* at *Jeffersonville*, whereby it appears
that full payment has been made for

*the Northwest quarter of Section
three, in Township two (South) of Range four (East)
containing one hundred and fifty-one acres,*

of the Lands directed to be sold at *Jeffersonville, Indiana*, by
the Act of Congress, entitled "An Act providing for the sale of the Lands
of the United States, in the Territory north-west of the Ohio, and
above the mouth of Kentucky River," and of the acts amendatory of the
same, *There is Granted*, by the United States, unto the said *George
Huffstutter, junr.* and to his heirs, the *quarter* lot or section of Land
above described: *To have and to hold* the said *quarter* lot
or section of Land, with the Appurtenances, unto the said *George Huffstutter, junr.*

Huffstutter, and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I have caused these letters to be made *PATENT*, and
the Seal of the GENERAL LAND OFFICE to be hereunto affixed.
