

Henry Huffstuttler/Huffstutter

The Salt Lake City Tribune reported on Monday November 25, 1940 that **Henry Huffstutter**, 45, had been killed in car wreck the previous Saturday night (November 23rd). It was actually **Henry Huffstuttler**. The surname spelling was correctly reported in the Reno Evening Gazette, Tuesday, December 10, 1940. The 1940 Federal Census listed **Henry Huffstuttler** (Ely, White Pine, Nevada) as born 1898 in Arkansas. The Tribune reported his mother as living in Arkansas. (RFH-1/3/13)

Two Women Hurt As Autos Collide Head-on

ELY, Nev.—Henry Huffstutter, 45, was killed in an automobile accident late Saturday night when his car and one driven by Mrs. C. C. Ring collided head on on the highway two miles below Kimberly, according to Sheriff J. E. Orrock.

Mr. Huffstutter was reported driving toward Kimberly when a car driven by Mrs. Ring came over a small rise traveling toward Ely, and the two cars crashed head on.

The front of Mr. Huffstutter's car was caved completely in and he was badly crushed by the impact. He was taken to an Ely hospital by Mr. and Mrs. Ted Harding and Mr. and Mrs. Linford Taylor, but died en route. Mrs. Ring and Mrs. M. Roberts, who was with Mrs. Ring, received cuts about the head and bruises. They were taken to hospital by Morris and Floyd Oxborough.

Mr. Huffstutter was shift boss with the Consolidated Copper Mines corporation at Kimberly. He was a World war veteran and member of Ruth post No. 33, American Legion.

He is survived by his mother in Arlene, Ark. Officers were unable to determine if he had other survivors as little is known of him in this district. Mrs. Ring and Mrs. Roberts reside near Kimberly and a short distance from where the accident took place.
